TELUS (TSX: T, T.A; NYSE: TU) is a leading national telecommunications company in Canada, with \$9.7 billion of annual revenue and 11.8 million customer connections including 6.3 million wireless subscribers, 4.1 million wireline network access lines, 1.2 million Internet subscribers and more than 100,000 TELUS TV customers. Led since 2000 by President and CEO, Darren Entwistle, TELUS provides a wide range of communications products and services including data, Internet protocol (IP), voice, entertainment and video. In support of our philosophy to give where we live, TELUS, our team members and retirees have contributed \$137 million to charitable and not-for-profit organizations and volunteered more than 2.6 million hours of service to local communities since 2000. TELUS the employer, taxpayer and investor

- TELUS employs more than 3,100 highly skilled workers in Montreal and has an annual total compensation in excess of \$169 million.
- TELUS has a strong executive leadership presence across Montreal with 12 members of the TELUS senior leadership team calling the city home including François Côté, executive vice-president and president of TELUS Québec and TELUS Health Solutions.
- Employees in Montreal earn an average hourly wage of \$25.40, with an average annual total compensation of more than \$54,000.
- In 2008, TELUS paid more than \$688,000 in property and business taxes to the City of Montreal.
- As part of our more than \$6.1 billion cumulative operating and capital investment in Quebec since 2000, TELUS has made significant investments in our wireless high-speed network, high-speed Internet service and other voice and data network infrastructure.
- TELUS announced on October 10, 2008 that it will build a next generation wireless network using the most advanced mobile broadband technology. This new network will be a full national launch in early 2010.

TELUS supports the environment

- In 2001, TELUS launched the Paperless Office initiative, e.Bill and other paper saving initiatives. Together, these initiatives have reduced paper consumption from 117 million sheets used by over 27,000 team members to 64 million sheets used by over 30,000 team members in 2008.
- In 2008, TELUS programs provided sponsorship for the planting of 170,162 trees through our partnership with Tree Canada.
- In 2008, TELUS recycled, refurbished, or repurposed 599 metric tonnes of e-waste (telecommunications equipment, IT equipment and electronics).

- Since 2005, TELUS has established nine community boards in Atlantic Canada, Rimouski, Montreal, Ottawa, Toronto, Calgary, Edmonton, Vancouver and Victoria engaging key community leaders to oversee the donation of more than \$16 million to 1,205 local grassroots charities across Canada. - In 2008, the TELUS Montreal Community Board donated over \$700,000 to local initiatives, such as the Montreal Junior Symphony Orchestra, Quebec Society for Disabled Children, Multiple Sclerosis Society of Canada and the Arthritis Society.
- TELUS is an active supporter of the Montreal Science Centre, Théâtre TELUS, the Montreal Alouettes and the 24 heures de Tremblant.
- TELUS team members and alumni contributed more than 34,000 hours of community service to charitable organizations in Quebec in 2008.
- In 2008, TELUS and its team members contributed more than \$150,000 to organizations in Montreal through the TELUS charitable giving program and \$12,300 through TELUS dollars for doers, our volunteer rewards program.
- In 2008, TELUS Day of Service had more than 582 team members and retirees donate time to worthwhile programs in Montreal and area.
